How to get started with your fundraising

1. Decide what you will do to raise money

What will you do to help our region's wildlife?

Be inspired by our list of activities and events on page 2 or think of something new. Do something you enjoy - it can be as silly or as spectacular as you like!

2. Get organised

- Who will you ask to help you organise your activity or event?
- Who might sponsor you?
- Who would like to take part with you?
- Where will you hold the event or challenge?
- Do you need to book a venue? If it's outside, where can you do it?
- When would be the best time to hold it?
- Think about the weather and school holidays and whether your event clashes with anything else!
- Remember to give yourself plenty of time. If you have a good amount of time to prepare, you can tell as many people as possible, get lots of sponsors and make sure you've thought of everything!

3. Contact us and tell us what you are doing

4. Collect money

All the information you will need on how to collect money and pay it in can be found at the end of this pack. You will also find a sponsor form with this pack that you can use to collect donations as well as www.justgiving.com/durhamwildlifetrust.

Remember you can start collecting money early - this will save you having to chase people after the event.

5. Spread the word about your activity or event

This fundraising pack includes our poster template for you to personalise to your fundraising event.

6. Consider health, safety and the law

It's really important that all safety aspects are thought about carefully, as Durham Wildlife Trust cannot be held responsible for any accidents or incidents that occur as a result of your activity. To make sure you're really safe you can contact your local council, or The Health and Safety Executive (www.hse.gov.uk) if you have any questions about holding events on public premises such as a school or workplace. For first aid advice, contact your local St John's Ambulance branch or the British Red Cross.

7. Once you've decided on the what, who, when and where of your event or activity, you will need to spread the word...

Use the materials in this pack

In this fundraising pack we have a poster template, cake flags and bunting for you to use. You can put these up locally and in places far and wide to let people know about your event. You could put posters up at work, your school, in the post office, local shop or library.

Tell everyone you know

See how many people you can tell by letting all of your friends and family know what you're doing and asking them to spread the word on your behalf. Social media is a great way to do this but don't forget your town or village newsletter, if you have one.

Let us know

8. After the event

It is always fantastic for us to hear about how your event went. It's even better when we can have a chat with you and get photos. We can then help to celebrate your successes by letting the local press know, and reporting your event on our website and/or in our magazine. Buy this cake and help us manage more spaces for wildlife.




Bunting
